Entries can be sold as they stand **or** with a Veterinary Certificate which must be from a member of the Govesbridge Veterinary panel

(NO other Veterinary Certificates will be accepted) and purchasers will have the option of re-examination. Vendors should contact a panel member no later than 14 days prior to sale to arrange an examination

FILLIES

All yearlings are sold subject to wind examination

BROODMARES

No flu vaccinations are required

C. E. M. Certificate (Contagious Equine Metritis) – See below

These certificates can be obtained from any equine veterinary surgeon

CONTAGIOUS EQUINE METRITIS (C.E.M.)

One swab from Clitoral Fossa taken within 30 days of sale – to be negative for C.E.M. N.B. It takes approximately 7 days to obtain a C.E.M. certificate from the day the swab is taken.

EQUINE VIRAL ARTERITIS (E.V.A.)

A blood sample taken within 30 days of sale to be negative for E.V.A.

Animals that have a negative result will be allowed enter the stable complex. Animals that have had a positive result for the first will need confirmation that a second test was taken and that the result was either negative or positive with a stable or declining titre. No certificate will mean mares/ fillies will not be allowed onto the premises.

FLU VACCINATIONS

2 primary injections to be given not less than 3 and not more than 13 weeks apart. If time permits a booster injection should be given not less than 5 and not more than 7 months apart. A further injection should be given every year.
